WHAT ARE WE VOTING FOR?

At the federal level, the purpose of this election is to vote on candidates for the offices of President and Vice-President of the United States, as well as all six of Louisiana's seats in the U.S. House of Representatives.

Every voter in the state will also have an opportunity to vote yes or no on a proposed amendment to the Louisiana Constitution. Some voters will also have one or more special elections on their ballot to fill vacancies in state offices.

Most parishes will also have some combination of regularly-scheduled municipal elections, special elections to fill local vacancies, and/or local propositions.

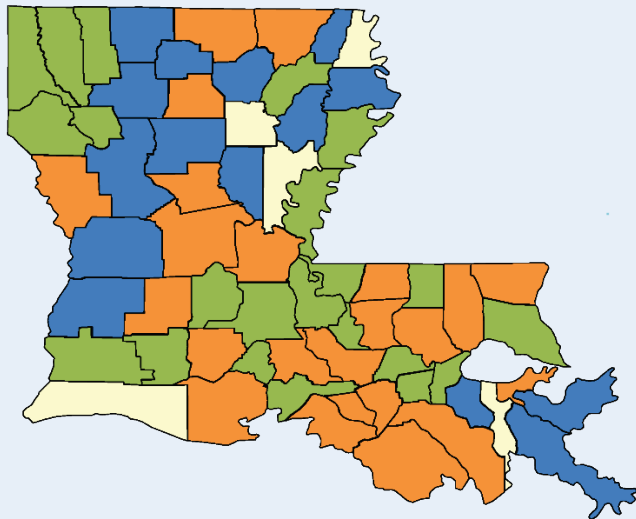

LOUISIANA AT A GLANCE



- **22 parishes will have local races but no local propositions:** Ascension, Bossier, Caddo, Calcasieu, Concordia, DeSoto, Evangeline, Iberia, Jefferson Davis, Lafayette, Pointe Coupee, Red River, Richland, St. Helena, St. James, St. John, St. Landry, St. Tammany, Tensas, Webster, West Baton Rouge, and West Feliciana.
- **5 parishes will have local propositions but no local races:** Caldwell, Cameron, Catahoula, East Carroll, and Jefferson.
- **22 parishes will have local races and local propositions:** Acadia, Allen, Assumption, Avoyelles, East Baton Rouge, East Feliciana, Grant, Iberville, Jackson, Lafourche, Livingston, Morehouse, Orleans, Rapides, Sabine, St. Martin, St. Mary, Tangipahoa, Terrebonne, Union, Vermilion, and Washington.
- **15 parishes will have state elections only:** Beauregard, Bienville, Claiborne, Franklin, LaSalle, Lincoln, Madison, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Plaquemines, St. Bernard, St. Charles, Vernon, West Carroll, and Winn.
